Now the Folk In Cornwall website gives them the chance to find out where and when things are happening. I've managed to get location maps for all the clubs and sessions on there to make them easier to find.

Finally, don't forget the festivals. The Cadwith Cove Inn, for many years host to folk events, have arranged a whole day of folk in July, while August Bank Holiday is the traditional and continuing home for the Cornwall Folk Festival in Wadebridge.

In September there is a weekend-long free festival based at the Old Albion Inn in Crantock, and the long running St Ives Festival is including a lot of folk events this year.

All in all it promises to be a busy summer of folk in Cornwall – lets hope for good weather.

Did Morris Dancing Have its **Origins in Cornwall?**

No one really knows, but one of the earliest documented records comes from the Steward's Accounts for Lanherne Manor in 1466-7 citina items procured "Disgysynges" and the "Moruske" of "Lady of Betty". The church accounts for St Columb also have several references to "Moryshe cotes" or similar between 1584 and 1597.

The Great London Chronicle records "spangled Spanish dancers" performing an energetic dance before Henry VII at the Christmas of 1494 some decades after this

It's safe to say that some form of Morris was happening in Cornwall in the middle ages, although it probably didn't look much like what can be seen today.

The photo, on the opposite page, of a bench end, in Altarnun Church shows someone in a costume that would not look too much out of place in a modern Morris side

It appears that this type of dancing was linked to the Church and took place in most rural villages at their church festivals where ale was given as a payment.

From the earliest documentation through to the 19th Century morris dancing seemed to have been widespread across England - although suppressed during The Protectorate. With the Industrial Revolution, many villagers moved to the towns and their village morris tradition ceased to exist.

The numbers of villages upholding their traditions dwindled up to the mid-19th Century, and the huge loss of young men in WWI ended a lot more traditions.

If it were not for the timely research into the living traditions by Cecil Sharp in the 1890s onward, the history may have been lost forever.

Today there are several different styles of Morris; the image that comes into the mind of most people is probably the Cotswold style as danced by Carn Brea, Trigg and Tywardreath, for example.

Cecil Sharp and others collected this tradition, so there is a lot of source material available for these teams to use as a basis for what they do.

Another tradition, as you can see performed by teams like Wreckers and Cat's Eye, comes from the area of the English and Welsh borders.

There is not so much source material available for this so teams tend to be more inventive in adapting the border tradition to their own particular style of dancing.

Morris is a living tradition so there have always been debates about how it should be done and by whom. The issue of whether or not women should dance has now been pretty much resolved - most of

Although widespread and diverse, it is perhaps a little more than fanciful to reflect that this wonderful part of social history could possibly have had its origins in Cornwall.

THE GOLANT TIDAL SESSION

HOW DO YOU START A SESSION?

When the session that had been running in Lostwithiel for 10 years ended last year, there was quite a bit of discussion what to do next. The problem was that nobody had really run the session, it just sort of happened every week. So nobody felt they really had authority to act – though, like me, they all probably hoped someone else would.

Time passed and my fancy turned to the idea that it would be nice to have a summer session outside, maybe by a river somewhere. I remembered that the pub at Golant had a terrace overlooking the river but I'd never organised anything before and it all seemed too difficult.

Then one day – I'm not sure why - I suddenly picked up the phone. "Can I speak to the landlord. - I'm the landlord. - I was wondering if it might be possible to have a folk session – When do you want to come" This stumped me as I hadn't thought as far as a date. Anyway we agreed a date and I emailed it to anyone I could think of.

So I drove down to Golant thinking maybe one or two people will turn up – and found over 20 waiting. Later in the evening someone asked when the next session was going to be and someone else said "what about next week".

After several sessions by the river autumn came - what would happen when we didn't want to be outside any more? This was effectively settled by the landlord who said - "Well you'll just move inside the pub".

The Golant session is still going. The pub changed hands last winter, but the new landlord is really keen – he even joins in the singing. Now it's summer we can go back outside as soon as it is warm enough to be pleasant.

So if, like I did, you have an itch to sing and play, but are not sure you can get anything going, why not have a go. Sometimes it only takes one phone call to start a session. If you need help with publicity there is the Folk in Cornwall website and facebook page – that's what we are here for, after all.



TUNE OF THE SEASON #3

The tune I have selected for this issue is a Scottish march written by Willie Lawrie, a native of Ballachulish, in Argyllshire, who won gold medals at both the Inverness and Oban piping championships in 1910. He wrote many popular marches, and become Pipe Major of the 8th Battalion Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders in 1914. Sadly he was to die an untimely death as a result of the battle after which this tune was named, in November 1916. The tune enjoyed a bit of a revival last year on the battle's centenary. As a march, it should be played slower than a slip jig, which is the type of tune often associated with 9/8 time. Once again, it would be great to see efforts uploaded on YouTube as **Folk in Cornwall TOTS#3**; all instruments and abilities would be viewed with interest.
