Cadgwith Folk Day - Thirty years and no arrests!

Saturday 13 July marks the 30th annual Cadgwith Folk Day, held in Cadqwith Cove on the Lizard Peninsula in Cornwall. Hosted by the Cadgwith Cove Inn, the event has seen top Cornish performers such as Will Keating, The Cornish Caledonian Pipe Band, Pensans Morris, with the gaps filled in by fiddlers, whistlers, local players, concertina banjo twangers, quitar fumblers, bouzouki bashers, punch & judy and a re-enactment of Nelson's Battle of the Nile.

Headlining this year, and ahead of his forthcoming tour of the Southern States of America, Ian Dunlop takes the stage at 4pm.

New band Cove featuring hammered dulcimer move in at 2.30 followed by Penzance crew Jay, Cee and Bee at 3.pm.

Altogether, from midday onwards, the line-up promises a truly disgraceful day. And it's free entry too with this year the Cadgwith Folk Day supporting Cornwall Music Therapy.

How many people have a guitar or ukelele that they got with the intention to learn tp play and then never found the time or got bored playing the instrument by themselves? Well here's the opportunity to inspire yourselves again, come along and have some fun playing and singing with other people. Once a month (roughly) is the UKEJAM held in the upper room of the Ship Inn. Polmear, Par on a Sunday (7:30pm in the summer and 3:30pm during the cold winter months) where a constantly changing group of people get together to sing and play well known songs and have fun. Admission is free. You could always indulge in a meal beforehand.

We always start with really easy 2 and 3 chord songs so that everyone can join in, even absolute beginners, as once you have felt the joy of making music in a group, it will inspire you to learn and improve. As the session goes along the chords become more varied and the changes faster, but everyone can still sing along, this is all about inclusivity, encouragement and having a good time. CARN BREA ALE AT HAYLE





JIM CAUSLEY AND MIRANDA SYKES PRESENT GHOSTS, WEREWOLVES AND COUNTRYFOLK - SONGS AND STORIES OF SABINE BARING-GOULD



Six-time BBC Folk Awards nominee Jim Causley and Miranda Sykes of Award-Winning Show of Hands and Daphne's Flight come together for the first time to celebrate the centenary of a Victorian superstar through his music and stories.

Sabine Baring-Gould inspired Bram Stoker's Dracula, Sherlock Holme's Hound and Bernard Shaw's Doolittle. He brought Ghostly Aunt Eliza, wretched heroine Mehalah and Norse hero Grettir to life. He mentored folk song collector Cecil Sharp - and wrote Onward Christian Soldiers

He was a giant of his time. He was a top ten best-selling novelist; the writer of what is still the go-to book on werewolves; author of a nervetingling book of ghost stories; storyteller of the Norse Myths of Iceland; compiler of a classic Dartmoor history book and composer of numerous popular hymns.

But he says the most important thing he did in his life was to collect songs from the countryfolk of Devon and Cornwall. A pioneer collector, starting a decade before Sharp and Vaughan Williams, he amassed more than 2000 songs.

Miranda, Jim and narrator John Palmer, director of the critically-acclaimed Vaughan Williams anniversary "From Pub to Pulpit" Cathedral tour, interweave some of those songs with anecdotes from his own astonishing life and stories from his impressive array of books.

Plus trips down memory lane with four screenings of Newlyn-based award-winning director Diana Taylor's new film Catch The Wind: St Ives In The 60s, with the title deriving from Donovan's song Catch The Wind, written on a visit to St Ives.

St Ia Parish Church, which has hosted Seth Lakeman and Cara Dillon over the past two years, has handed a hugely-anticipated September Festival debut to The Trouble Notes, a progressive world folk trio featuring performers from three continents: American violinist Bennet Cerven, German guitarist Florian Eisenschmidt and Australian drummer Julian Lardis.

Fast-rising Cornish folk-pop duo True Foxes are going back to Church prior to their prestigious Costa Festival debut in Portugal in October.

Ross Couper Band - THE HOMEROAD

These beardy boys from Shetland can certainly set your speakers on fire with some great driving original and trad. tunes. Ross has been a long time member of the innovative band the Peatbog Faeries. Rooted in the traditional music of the northern isles but sounding fresh and vibrant the tunes drive along with energy and wonderfully emotive playing. Ross's fiery fiddle playing



is well supported by some very talented musicians in the band comprising of drums, melodeon, piano and bass. This is definitely one to grace any CD collection or to have a place on your playlist.



MOJNA - VANTENATTER

This Swedish/Norwegian trio have made a fascinating and enjoyable instrumental album that is very easy on the ear. The playing is lyrical and emotive with an instrumentation of guitar, clarinet and hardanger fiddle. Most tracks are very gentle and soothing but there is a bit of bite in there as well. It's just that bit different to the sounds of the British Isles and for me that is one reason that it is so enjoyable. Nordic folk

music is at the heart of the music, but it doesn't limit it with other musical idioms and influences coming through. Highly recommended.





RUM RAGGED - GONE JIGGIN'

This exploration of the traditional music of Newfoundland has an awful lot to recommend it. I was immediately taken with the music on this album mixing jazz, swing and folk idioms in an intriguing mix with Julie's vocals demonstrating emotional depth and sensitivity. This album is only available as a download but I've included it because it's differently Cornish. This Cornish Cuban band have written new songs that tell the stories of incredible men and women who went out to the Caribbean in the days of exploration and settlement, going back over 400 years. The music is very much Latin American performed with guitar bass and percussion. There are tales of maroonings, gold and copper mining, dangerous voyages, slavery resistance, romance, camels, yellow fever and much more. They will take you from Cornwall to Cuba, Jamaica, Barbados, Guyana, and many other parts of the West Indies. Check it out.
