

Welcome to Issue 31 of Folk in Cornwall. I was saddened to learn of the recent death of Mike Kessell. Mike was a very fine Cornishman, traditional singer and musician who, I'm sure, will be much missed by many both in the Folk and wider communities. I hadn't seen him for quite a while, but way back in the 1980s we were both members of Tattered Swan Morris.

Tattered Swan were, to coin a phrase, something completely different. At the time they were formed there were no other Border sides in Cornwall. The photo below shows us dancing outside the Greenbank pub. Mike is the righ hand concertina player. As well as being a musician for Tattered Swan he also danced. In fact the side had a rule that all our musicians should also be dancers - and for one dance required them to do both at the same time! The result was an ever changing and varied musical line up that as well as the usual melodeons and concertinas at times included us dancing to bagpipes.



Tattered Swan embraced that fact that traditionally Border Morris was not a respectable activity, being basically a way for peasants to extort money or drink from the gentry - and had a lot of fun in the process.

They also created all the dances they performed making them unique. Happily versions of a couple of the dances have been re-created by Tywardreath Morris - although they haven't been able to reproduce the more disreputable features of the originals. I've also heard that one of the Tattered Swan dances in now performed by a Morris Team in New Zealand, but I've no idea how it got to the other side of the world.

Meavy based Dartmoor Border Morris will be hosting this year's Pudsey day of Morris in Bedford Square Tavistock on Saturday 16th November. This will be the 9th event that the side have hosted and this year there will be 16 Morris sides performing in and around Tavistock.

The event organiser - known amongst the Morris fraternity as Treggie - says sides are expected to come from both locally and further afield. Newly formed Oryon Morris from Falmouth, along with Wild Moon Morris from Somerton are traveling the furthest to attend, along with other amazing & talented sides like Catseye Morris, Enigma Morris, Grimspound Morris, Otter Morris, and Plymouth Clog Morris to name just a few. Around 200 performers are expected, dancing with hankies, sticks, or garlands of flowers to the merry sound of live musicians playing an array of fine tunes, some ancient, some modern, but all live and not pre-recorded!

The day is designed to be a fund-raising event with proceeds going to the BBC Children in Need appeal. Mr Pudsey bear is usually the guest of honour and will be led around Tavistock by a member of Dartmoor Border, so please come and say hello. To date, this Morris To date, this Morris dance event has raised £11,412 with every penny collected going to the appeal.

The day kicks off at 10am with Morris dancing in Bedford Square, plus the entrance to the Guildhall and outside the craft & knitting shop in the pannier market, with Morris sides dancing in hour long slots before swapping over with new teams coming to dance, so there is a constant flow of Morris dancing.

The live street performance will continue through till around 4pm when they will move to the Stannary Arms pub where thanks to Dartmoor Brewery, a pint of Jail Ale will cost £2 & the music session will continue till the beer runs out.



And then if they come up afterwards buy merchandise and sign up to the mailing list, I know I've got another fan or two, and hopefully they'll tell their friends to check out my music."

Cousin Jack in Ireland?

I recently came across a folk tradition in Wexford, Ireland which consists of a team of Mummers who arrive in costumes in groups of 12. They then proclaim their venerable roots and perform a Mumming Play (with a script similar to many such plays in England). They then perform a stick dance to local tunes such as "Kelly the Boy from Killane".

It could be seen as a sword dance or a stick dance as the swords are all wooden. The dance steps and choreography are nothing to do



with Border or Cotswold Morris and have a distinctly Irish feel to them.

The dancers are nowadays both male and female, and several different mumming groups perform in this Eastern part of Ireland. But... they have a folk myth that this dancing has been handed down to them by an unspecified shipwrecked Cornishman.

There are no known stick dances which started off in Cornwall in previous centuries, or least none that have been collected or recorded. The Catholic Church tried to ban the mumming in the 1930's, but it has continued to this day, using both versions in the English and Irish tongue.

If you look at the costumes, then the Bishop's Mitres and sashes (baldricks?) in green and yellow seem prominent. Even more prominent is a single figure in Black, decorated with white crosses.

It doesn't seem that this is St Piran himself, even if he did cross over from Ireland on a millstone. Instead it seems to be St Columb, so major or minor links to Cornish link are possible.

The other characters can include Nationalist heroes such as Daniel O'Connell , Napoleon and even Nelson. Mumming in Ireland seems to be traceable back to 1780, so I think it is unlikely that we can trace the actual errant Cousin Jack.

It's nice that they think it's Cornish - even is it leaves us scratching our heads. There is similar puzzlement over the Britannia Coconut Dancers of Bacup, who also claim Cornish roots.

If only Dolly Pentreath had left a written record for us to study. Instead we have enthusiastic films on YouTube.

The inspiration for this publication was called Folknews Kernow and was produced, for many years, by Chris Ridley. Having always enjoyed Folknews, when Chris decided to stop production it seemed a shame that the information it provided would no longer be available. So with the help of a few friends I decided to produce a replacement. The main purpose of the original was to provide details of folk events happening in Cornwall and contacts for the Folk Clubs, Dance Clubs and Morris sides existing in the county and this is still the main purpose of Folk in Cornwall.

Although the producion of each issue is basically a one person operation, what's inside it depends almost entitrely on other people providing content by sending us details and information about what's happening - or going to happen - in Cornwall. Without them there would be no magazine so their efforts are much appreciated and I take this opportunity to give them a big vote of thanks.

Also due a vote of thanks are our loyal band of advertisers, most of whom have been with us since that first issue in 2017. The income received from advertising has basically paid for the cost of producing the magazine.

Like Folknews, Folk in Cornwall is distributed free through clubs and libraries with the cost of production covered by the adverts in each issue, by individual subscriptions and by voluntary donations from various organisations. COHEN BRAITHWAITE-KILCOYNE - PLAY UP THE MUSIC





At this years Wadebridge festival I wandered into the FAR stage and was immediately struck by the vocal similarity of Tessa, accompanying herself just on guitar, with Brenda. This comes over most strongly on the CD on the unaccompanied songs, especially 'Window in St Ives' which sums up so much of local peoples experience of living in a tourist area. Nicole has always lived in St Ives and these 12 songs reflect the real gritty life of a fishing port rather than the tourist hot-spot it has



become. The songs are derived from personal experience and cover a wide range of deeply felt emotions that will speak to any Cornish native. She deserves to be known much more widely.
